CONDITIONS - TO BE RETAINED BY COMPETITOR

1. No player shall be eligible to compete unless he or she has attained the qualifying age of 40, 45, 50, 55, 60, 65 or 70 by **1st January 2007**; is in good standing with his or her national association; and has been for at least one month immediately preceding the closing date for entry into the tournament (a) a playing member of a club affiliated (i) to BADMINTON England, or (ii) to an Association in membership with the Badminton World Federation [BWF]; or (b) an Individual Associate Member of BADMINTON England. A declaration to these effects shall be signed by every prospective competitor.
2. A competitor may only enter one age group in each event (but may play in a different age group in different events if otherwise eligible). The Committee reserves the right not to run events in which the entry is less than four pairs (3 players for singles events) and to restrict entries for all events. Past results may be taken into account. The committee also reserves the right to refuse entries in any event without assigning any reason, and to modify the programme in any way it sees fit. Its decision in all matters shall be final.
3. All entries must be made on the official form and must be received by the Championship Secretary with entry fees by **Wednesday 14th February 2007**. Each competitor must send in a separate entry form, and no pair will be accepted unless entry forms and fees have been received from both players. If at its discretion the Committee should accept entries and/or fees after this date there will be a SURCHARGE of £5.00 per player. The Committee will do its best to find partners for any competitors in any of the events, if they are unable to find their own, but no guarantees can be given. Any competitor who is without a partner for any event and wants to be included in that event should write, "partner wanted" in the appropriate place on the entry form.
4. All competitors must be prepared to play on the day and at the time(s) stated for the commencement of each event. If a later time is stated in the appropriate column on the entry form, the Referee will consider this, but no guarantee can be given. Each competitor will be notified of the time of their first match in each event entered. If no such notification has been received by 4 days prior to the Championships it is the responsibility of the competitor to enquire from the Championships Secretary. Competitors must report to the Referee immediately on arrival, and must not leave the venue without the Referee's permission. Any competitor not ready to play when called will be liable to be scratched. Play shall not take place on days other than those specifically sanctioned, and no competitor shall be obliged to commence a match before 10 a.m. or after 11 p.m. on any day. Any competitor who is not prepared to play outside the times of play shall be entitled to a return of his or her entry fee.
5. The entry fee is £18.50 GBP (incl.VAT) per competitor for each event entered. P.O's/Cheques should be made payable to 'BADMINTON England'. Please do not post cash.
6. Yonex AS-50 Feather Shuttlecocks will be used.
7. The events will be run in accordance with the Competition Regulations of the Badminton World Federation and Regulations for Tournaments as published in the 2001-2002 Handbook of Badminton Association of England Limited with any subsequent amendments.
8. The draw will be seeded and the early rounds of events will be played in groups. There shall be no alteration in the published draw except as permitted in BWF and BADMINTON England Regulations (see Condition 12 below). The period for knocking up before any match shall not exceed three minutes. There will be NO 60 second or 2 minute intervals between games
9. **SCORING.** The Rally Points Scoring system shall be used, as outlined within the Laws of Badminton. A match will be the best of 3 games to 21 points, At 20 all, the side gaining a 2 point lead first shall win that game. At 29 all, the side scoring the 30 point wins that game.
10. **CLOTHING.** All clothing worn during play must be acceptable badminton sports clothing. Each article of clothing may be of any colour or combination of colours. It is recommended that doubles partners wear the same colours. Abstract designs are permitted when devoid of advertising, commercial or promotional content or when forming part of an advert under the following regulation and falling wholly within the permitted dimensions. The front of the shirt may carry the flag or emblem of the country or county represented. The family name and, if desired, initials may appear on the back of the shirt in capital letters in one single colour between 6-10 centimetres in height, in a contrasting panel if the shirt is patterned, horizontal and placed near the top. The country or county represented may also appear below the name (if shown)(the same conditions on lettering apply). Below the name and country or county (if shown) advertising in accordance with condition 11 may appear. The decision of the Referee on the suitability of clothing and advertising is final.
11. **ADVERTISING.** The shirt may carry up to three adverts each of 20 square centimetres or less, no more than one on any of the following five places: left collar, right collar, left sleeve, right sleeve, or front; and advertising contained in a band of uniform width not exceeding 10 centimetres which may be at any angle and may be on the front or back or both. Each sock and shoe may carry two adverts of 20 square centimetres or less. Other articles of clothing may carry one such advert. The adverts referred to in this paragraph may be the clothing manufacturer's emblem or that of any sponsor.
12. **PRIZES.** Winners and losing finalists will receive a product prize to the value of approximately £25 and £12.50 respectively provided sufficient entries are received.
13. **WITHDRAWAL.** Notification of withdrawal before the Championships start must be given immediately to the Referee, or if not available, the Championship Secretary using the contact details shown overleaf. Confirmation of any telephone call must be sent in writing to the Championship Secretary. Withdrawal during the Championships must be notified to the Referee or Deputy Referee directly.
14. **PENALTIES.** The following penalty system will apply:

	Maximum Penalty
(a) Failure to arrive without notification	£100
(b) Failure to arrive with notification within a reasonable period but without proper reason	£50
(c) Late arrival on court without proper reason	£20

Note: A player who has been penalised under the Penalty System has the right to appeal against the penalty imposed but is should be carefully noted that all appeals **MUST BE IN WRITING** to BADMINTON England and made within one month of the close of the tournament.
15. **DRUG TESTING.** To be eligible to participate or assist any participant in any event or activity organised or authorised by or held under the rules of the Association wherever held, you must comply with the current Anti-Doping Policy of the Association and shall be deemed to have agreed with and consented to these Rules. A copy of this Policy is available on the BADMINTON England website [www.badmintonengland.co.uk]. You should be advised that participants may be subject to random testing for drugs at any time during the event by agents sanctioned by the Association or the Badminton World Federation. Failure to comply with a request for testing may result in you being subject to the same sanctions as for a positive doping test.
